Hidden Lake Parkette Officially Opens

HALTON HILLS, ON – The fall season marked the perfect time for the official opening of the Hidden Lake Parkette. This \$220,000 project saw an array of amenities benefiting children and local recreational enthusiasts alike.

“This parkette is another example of why our community ranks so highly in terms of quality of life,” said Mayor Bonnette. “Staff consulted with the community and then worked with local companies to build a beautiful space. My congratulations to everyone who was involved!”

The Hidden Lake Trail Parkette leverages its location with the surrounding features and green space to connect with the Gellert Community Centre trail system and overlook a stormwater management pond. Strategic berms and planting frame the park with the surrounding residential neighbourhood.

Public consultation was integral to designing a space that met the needs and desires of the local community with the high response rate indicative of residents’ interest in the project. Specific items that arose from the input included the creation of a large open lawn space, a basketball half court and 4 swings. Of interest is the children’s playground which includes a climbing net -- the first of its kind in Halton Hills.
