New Exhibition at the Cultural Centre

HALTON HILLS, ON – A new exhibition is on view in the Helson Gallery at the Town of Halton Hills Cultural Centre. *Celebrating Artists of Wenjiang China* brings together sixty works by contemporary artists from the Town of Halton Hills' sister city. Traditional scroll paintings, photographs and examples of calligraphy will evoke the landscape and culture of Wenjiang District in the City of Chengdu. The exhibition continues until October 29.
