NEW EXHIBITIONS AT THE CULTURAL CENTRE

HALTON HILLS, ON –Two new exhibitions are now on view at the Town of Halton Hills Cultural Centre. In the Helson Gallery, *The Inspired Eye: Canadian Women Artists* celebrates the contributions of women to our country’s developing arts scene during the first half of the 20th century. Works by noted female artists have been generously lent from private collections for the exhibition. An opening reception and exhibition talk will be held on November 5 from 2 – 4 p.m. at the Helson Gallery; the exhibition continues until mid-January 2018.

In the Sisnett Lobby, an exhibition of the Georgetown Rug Hooking Guild will be on view from October 30 to November 26, 2017. “It’s inspiring to see the work of women artists and artisans from both national and local levels,” said Mayor Rick Bonnette.

The Helson Gallery is located at 9 Church St., Halton Hills and is open Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays: 1 – 5 p.m. and on Thursdays: 1 – 8:30 p.m. There is no admission fee charged to visit the exhibitions.

The Town of Halton Hills, with a population of approximately 60,000, consists of two urban centres, Georgetown and Acton, with three hamlets – Glen Williams, Stewarttown and Norval – and several smaller settlements.
