RESIDENTS ASKED TO REPORT ACTS OF VANDALISM

HALTON HILLS, ON – In response to recent incidences of vandalism at Glen Williams Park, the Town of Halton Hills would like to remind residents to report such acts through our online feedback form or by directly calling the Town.

Town staff noticed major damage done to field #2 at Glen Williams Park. The chain was cut to access the field and the cost of repairs will be very expensive.

The Town of Halton Hills takes all forms of vandalism very seriously. Staff always cooperates with the Halton Regional Police to apprehend suspects in such cases.

“These activities are illegal,” said Mayor Bonnette. “Repairing Town property is not cheap, and it is not appropriate to put the financial responsibility back on taxpayers.”

Residents who spot vandalism may call Service Halton Hills at 905-873-2601 or fill out the Public Feedback Form on the website at haltonhills.ca/contact/comment.php. If residents witness an act in progress, they are asked to call Halton Regional Police immediately at 911.

The Town of Halton Hills, with a population of approximately 60,000, consists of two urban centres, Georgetown and Acton, the Halton Hills Premier Gateway employment area, three hamlets – Glen Williams, Stewarttown and Norval – and several smaller settlements. Halton Hills has long been recognized for its natural beauty, active agricultural community, high quality of life and proximity to major centres, including Brampton, Mississauga and Toronto. The Town is ranked as one of the top small communities in Canada by a national magazine.
