Defendant's Options:

Currently, as noted on the back of the Parking Ticket, only "Voluntary Payment" within a 15 day period, or a "Trial Option" is available.

Convenient **on-line** payment of a parking ticket at any hour of the day from anywhere in Canada at www.haltonhills.ca/parking.

Municipal Parking Lots

The Town provides various "free" parking in select municipal lots in the Acton and Georgetown downtown areas.

Overnight parking is prohibited in municipal parking lots between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. to allow for maintenance work. At certain select locations, Permits may be granted by the Town to allow overnight parking.

A Resident's Guide



(ON- STREET) PARKING REGULATIONS

The Town of Halton Hills works in partnership with you, the resident, to make our Town a great place to live, work and play.

This brochure is one of a series of Resident's Guides we have developed to explain Town procedures.

We hope you find it helpful.

PARKING CONTROL SERVICES:

Parking is regulated in the Town of Halton Hills under the Uniform Traffic Control By-Law No. 84-1, Off-Street Parking By-Law No. 2005-0117 and Fire Route Parking By-Law No. 2005-0130 for public safety, maintenance and accessibility of our residents. Familiarizing yourself with the Town's Parking By-laws can help you to avoid receiving an offence notice.

The following "On-Street" parking regulations are in effect in the Town of Halton Hills (excerpts from the Town of Halton Hills Uniform Traffic Control By-Law No. 84-1):

No person shall park a vehicle:


- In any area where "No Parking" or "No Stopping" signs are on display
- Longer than five (5) hours at any time, unless otherwise posted
- Overnight (Winter) Prohibition (2:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m., November 15 to April 15)
- No Commercial Motor Vehicle parking on-street, unless otherwise posted
- Within 1.0 metres of a driveway or 3.0 metres of a commercial or public laneway
- Within 3.0 metres of a fire hydrant
- Facing the wrong direction on the road or in excess of 15 cm away from curb line
- On or overhanging a sidewalk
- Within a boulevard (between sidewalk and curb), unless otherwise permitted
- In a manner that obstructs traffic, road repair or snow removal
- On any highway for the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale
- In a space designated for persons with disabilities without displaying a valid disabled person's parking permit

Temporary Exemptions to 5 Hour Limit or Overnight (Winter) Ban:

- If you need extra parking on the street because of driveway repairs or home maintenance activity, visitors or special functions, temporary exemptions to the uniform 5 Hour Parking limit and Overnight Prohibition (2:00 a.m. – 6:00 a.m., November 15 to April 15) can be obtained from the Town of Halton Hills. All other posted parking or stopping restrictions would remain in effect.
- To **obtain** a Parking Exemption, visit the Town's website at www.haltonhills.ca, or call the Clerk's Department at 905-873-2601, ext. 2330 and leave a voice mail message. Please be prepared to provide the license plate number of the vehicle(s) to be parked on the street and expected time duration.
- A parking exemption will not be granted for unlicensed or immobile vehicles, commercial vehicles or school buses. The temporary exemptions are not intended to provide supplemental parking space for residents with more personal vehicles than their driveway or garage can accommodate. An exemption may not be granted due to inclement weather during winter or if the parking activity interferes with road maintenance.
- On-Street Parking Exemptions are limited to **six (6) occasions (per vehicle) per year, maximum four (4) days.**



Maximum 5 Hour Parking Time Restriction
No person shall park a vehicle on any street for a period longer than 5 hours, unless otherwise posted. **Regulation is enforced on a complaint basis.**



Overnight Parking Prohibition (Winter)
To facilitate winter road maintenance activities, on-street parking is prohibited between 2:00 a.m. - 6:00 a.m. from November 15 to April 15, on all Town streets, unless otherwise exempted from a posted '12 Hour' limit zone. **Regulation is proactively enforced during the winter months.**

No Parking of Commercial Motor Vehicles
Large vehicles such as straight trucks/tractors or buses are prohibited from parking on any street under Town jurisdiction, unless otherwise posted.



No Parking Anytime Sign
In a posted No Parking Zone, you are permitted to bring your vehicle to a brief stop to allow the exit or entering of passengers or cargo.



No Stopping Anytime Sign
You are at no time to stop your vehicle in a posted No Stopping Zone, unless directed by a police officer, traffic control device or the stopped flow of traffic.



Accessible Person Parking Permit Sign
Any vehicle without an approved Provincial Permit displayed that is found in a space designated as parking for physically challenged individuals will be subject to a \$350 set fine.
