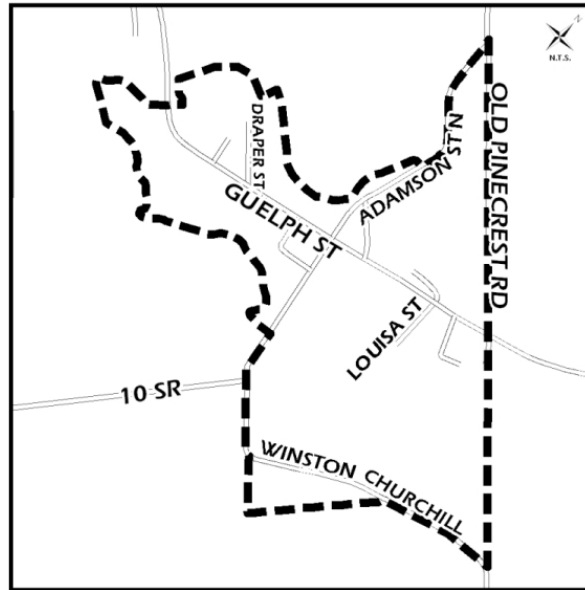




NOTICE OF 2nd PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE & WORKSHOP

HAMLET OF NORVAL SECONDARY PLAN REVIEW: PHASE 2 of 5

The Town of Halton Hills has initiated a review of the Hamlet of Norval Secondary Plan which was adopted by Council in 2001 and approved by the Region of Halton in 2003. Since the approval of the Secondary Plan there have been significant changes in the Provincial and Regional planning environment. The purpose of the review is to develop updated goals, objectives, and a policy framework for Norval which reflects the existing policy environment while also taking into consideration the community's needs.

A 2nd Public Open House and Workshop is being held to complete Phase 2 of the study which considers land use and policy alternatives for Norval.

The purpose of the 2nd Open House and Workshop is to:

- Provide a status/progress update on the study to date
- Present a Policy Alternatives Report prepared by the consulting team which identifies preliminary policies and land use options for Norval
- Solicit public and stakeholder input on the Policy Alternatives Report and the preliminary policies and land use options
