

The Town of Halton Hills is seeking volunteers who are interested in serving on the Steering Committee for the Mature Neighbourhoods Character Study.

The Mature Neighbourhoods Character Study will respond to recent large scale residential redevelopment in the Town, often referred to as "monster homes". The Study will examine whether the regulatory framework of the Town's Zoning By-law is effective in maintaining the character and integrity of the Town's mature neighbourhoods, and propose recommendations for amendments if necessary. The role of the Steering Committee will be to:

- · provide comments during the study process;
- assist with issue identification and resolution;
- liaise with key community stakeholders to ensure study awareness; and,
- meet as needed, to monitor the progress of the study.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to serve on the Steering Committee, applicants must:

- be a resident and/or land owner of the Town's mature single-detached residential neighbourhoods, developed prior to 1990, generally located north of Hungry Hollow in Georgetown and west of Churchill Road in Acton;
- be over the age of 18 years;
- demonstrate a strong knowledge or interest in maintaining the character of the Town's mature neighbourhoods; and,
- not be employed by the Town of Halton Hills.

Application Criteria

By the deadline of 4:30pm on Thursday, March 31, 2016, applicants must:
