Town of Halton Hills

The taxes the Town collects are split between the municipality, Halton Region (and Halton Regional Police Services) and the boards of education. The Town of Halton Hills receives 50.4% of every tax dollar to deliver services such as parks and recreation, roads, planning and library.

Halton Regional Police Services (HRPS)

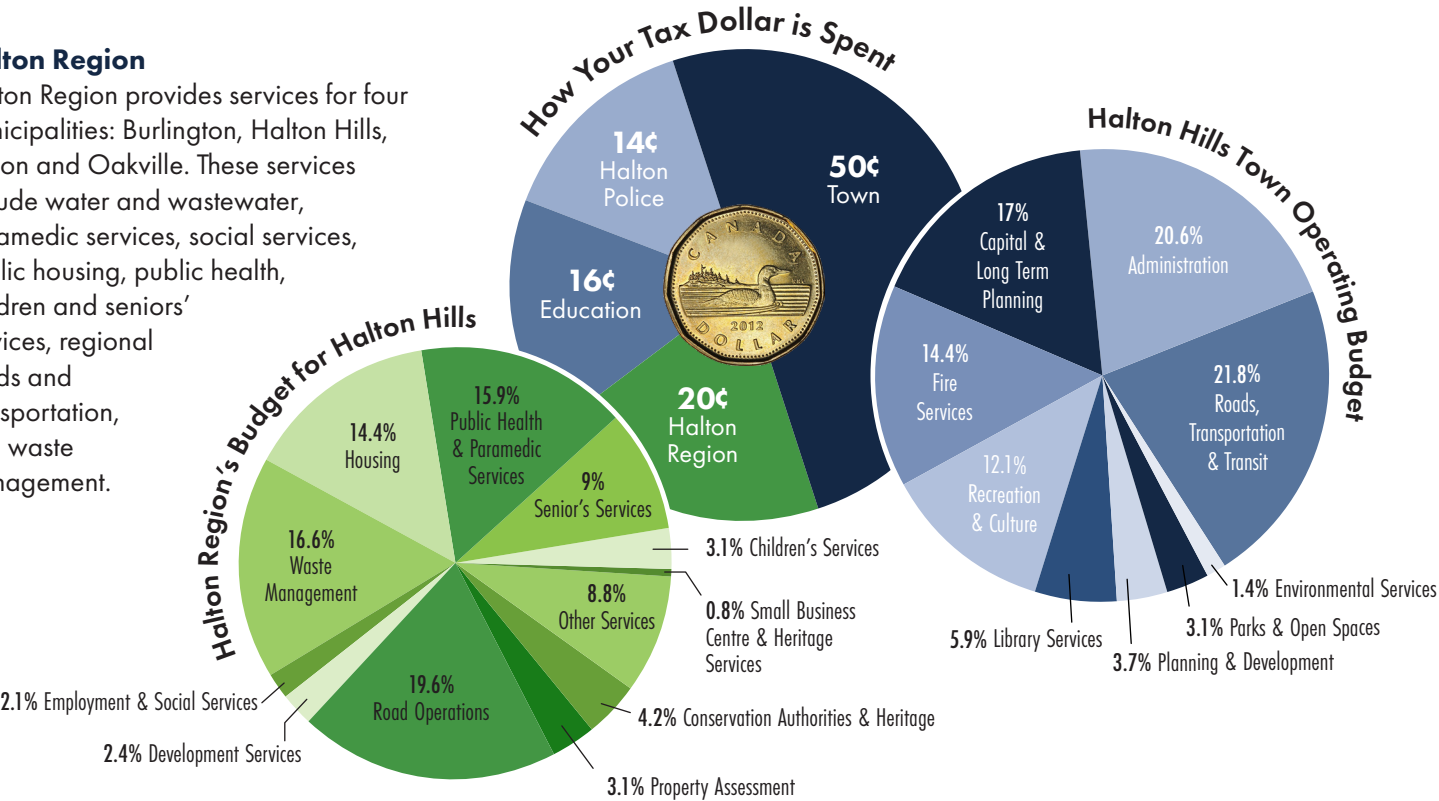
The police budget is approved by Halton Region Council. In Halton Hills, the police operate out of 10 Division in Acton and 11 Division in Georgetown. The police work in enforcement, crime and education.

Boards of Education

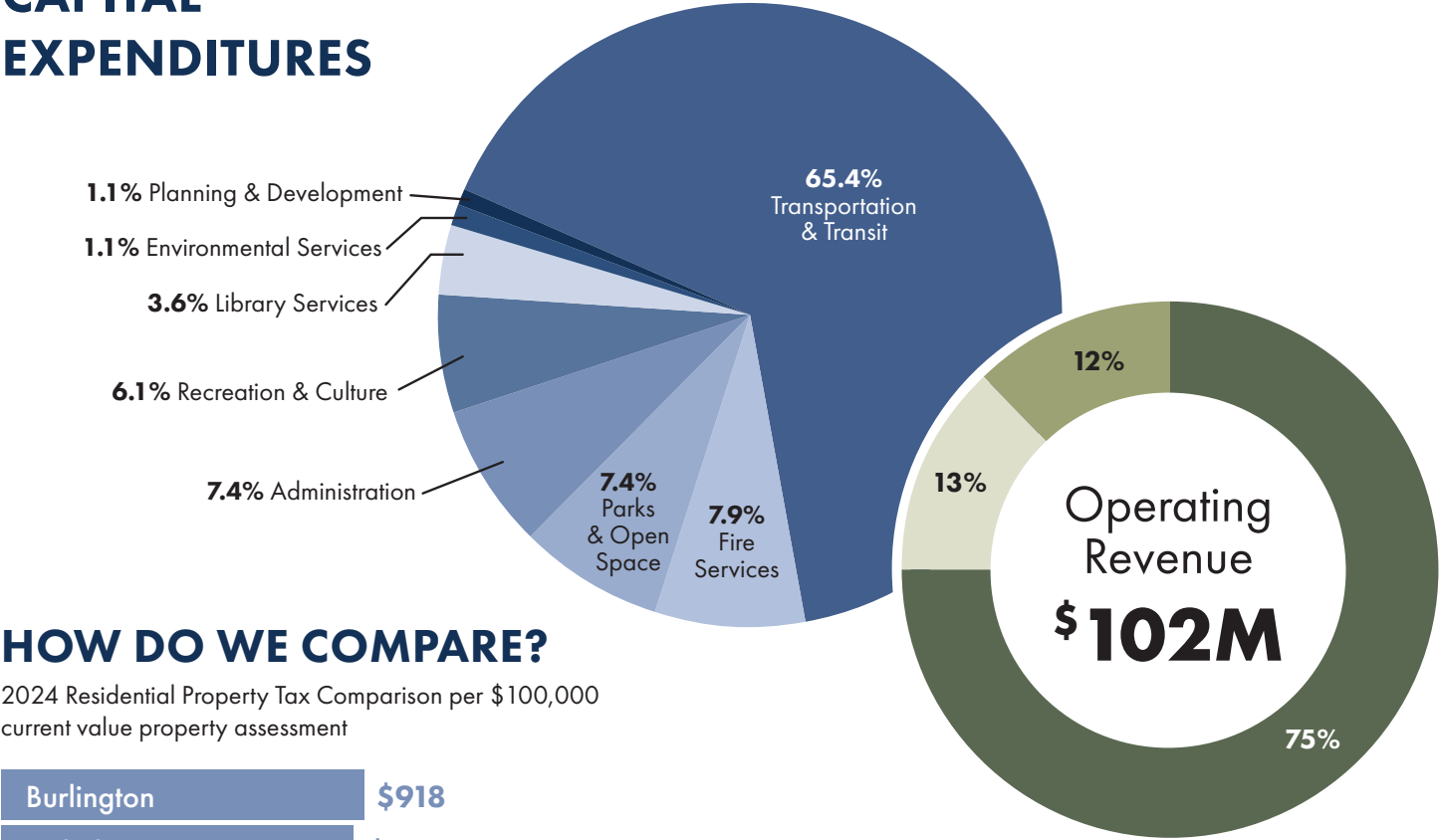
Residents choose to which school board (public or catholic) they wish to direct their taxes. The tax rate is set by the Provincial Ministry of Finance. The Town collects the taxes on behalf of the Ontario Ministry of Education which then allocates the funds to the school boards. Education taxes have not increased since 2020.

Halton Region

Halton Region provides services for four municipalities: Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville. These services include water and wastewater, paramedic services, social services, public housing, public health, children and seniors’ services, regional roads and transportation, and waste management.
