Weekly Incident Summary

May 22-June 4, 2017

HALTON HILLS, ON –

Monday, May 22, 2017

11:10 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on River Dr. Fire staff entered the rear yard and was met by homeowner who did not have valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the burn permit process was explained for future burns.

16:47 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Killaloe Cres. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the burn permit process was explained for future burns.

17:58 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Durham St. On scene fire staff gained entry to the apartment where they could smell something burning and a slight haze was visible. The entire apartment was checked and it was determined that an empty plug-in deodorizer was the source. The unit was unplugged and the apartment ventilated. No other issues found.

18:24 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Dufferin St. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who was not burning within the permit parameters of their permit. The fire was extinguished and the homeowner was reminded to only burn clean dried wood to avoid any problems and excessive smoke in the future.

Tuesday, May 23, 2017

09:08 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Argyll Rd. On scene fire staff entered the home and found no issues or concerns. Cleared the scene.

12:27 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a vehicle on fire in the area of Old Pine Crest Rd & Adamson St N in Norval. On scene fire staff was directed to a small fire in the trunk that had been extinguished by the driver. Following a brief investigation staff determined the small fire was created from a short in the wiring. After it was discovered that the vehicle had no rear brake lights, lights, or signals, the driver was not permitted to drive the vehicle home.

Thursday, May 25, 2017

16:26 Hours - Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Lynden Circle. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff assisted with patient care and cleared the scene.

16:57 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a single-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of 10 Sideroad and Fourth Line. On scene fire staff disabled the vehicle and provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

Friday, May 26, 2017

01:35 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Todd Road. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised there was no alarms going off. Fire staff entered the building and confirmed there were no concerns and cleared the scene.

04:58 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Eighth Line and Five Sideroad. Halton Regional Police was on scene upon arrival. Fire staff assisted with removing patients from the vehicles and cleared the scene.

Saturday, June 27, 2017

15:53 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Park Ave. On scene fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

18:39 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Delrex Blvd. On scene fire staff found an extinguished fire with evidence of green yard waste in and around the fire area. The homeowner did not have a burn permit and the process to obtain one was explained for any future burns.

20:47 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Meadowlark Dr. On scene fire staff entered the home where they found a defective smoke alarm in the basement. Fire staff removed the defective alarm and installed a new one.

Sunday, May 28, 2017

08:57 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Ballantine Dr. On scene fire staff entered the home and after investigation, it was determined that the detector in the basement was faulty. The homeowner was going to purchase a new hard-wired detector to replace.

13:28 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of smoke in the area on River Dr. On scene fire staff walked around the entire area and was unable to locate or smell any smoke in the area.

14:03 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of an airplane in distress in the area of Regional Road 25 and 25 Sideroad. Both occupants were standing outside of the plane with no injuries and no major damage to the plane. The pilot explained that the plane began to sputter and they were afraid they would not make it to Burlington Airport. The scene was turned over the Halton Regional Police.

14:38 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a single-vehicle motor vehicle collision on 15 Sideroad. On scene fire staff assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with packaging the patient onto the ambulance and cleared the scene.

18:25 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on River Dr. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who was asked to extinguish the fire due to a smoke complaint.

Monday, May 29, 2017

11:13 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Guelph St and Hall Road. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff disabled the vehicles and cleared the scene.

14:21 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Standish St. Halton Regional Police was on scene upon arrival. Fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

18:36 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a tree/hydro pole on fire on Confederation St. On scene fire staff found a large portion of a tree fallen onto the wires. The tree was smouldering until Hydro could isolate the power. Fire staff closed the road with assistance of Halton Regional Police until hydro completed their work.

Tuesday, May 30, 2017

09:24 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Regional Road 25 and 15 Sideroad. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

13:18 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a public assist on Dayfoot Drive. On scene fire staff investigated the homeowners complaint of gas/rotten egg smell. Fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. Fire staff spoke with neighbouring construction workers who advised that a piece of heavy equipment had an oil leak, being the possible cause of odour. No further action required.

Wednesday, May 31, 2017

17:23 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Steeles Ave & Ninth Line. On scene fire staff stabilized the vehicle, extracted the patient and assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with patient care until Ornge Air Ambulance arrived.

Thursday, June 1, 2017

13:24 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Chelvin Dr. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. Due to the age of the detectors, the homeowner was advised to have them replaced.

15:21 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Rexway Dr. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that the alarm was caused by an overheated candy machine being used for a school function. The machine was moved outside and the system reset.

16:45 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Wylie Cr. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings.

Friday, June 2, 2017

08:20 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of smoke in the area of Argyll & Mountainview Rd. On scene fire staff spoke with a worker who was cutting concrete that was causing large dust plumes. No fire or emergency.

12:03 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Morningside Dr. On scene fire staff met with the homeowners who advised that burnt toast had caused the alarm to active. No further concerns.

21:01 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Delrex Blvd. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who was advised to let the fire burn out and not to put anything else on the fire due to a burn complaint received.

21:28 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Killaloe Cr. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have a valid burn. The homeowner was informed to let the fire burn out, and to obtain a permit.

Saturday, June 3, 2017

09:24 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a possible fire on Steeles Ave. On scene fire staff found a large fire of construction materials. Fire staff extinguished the fire and spoke to the homeowner who did not have a valid burn permit. The homeowner was advised of the burn permit process for any future burns.

10:19 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a motor vehicle collision in the area of Guelph & Chapel Streets. Patients were in the care of Halton Regional Paramedics upon arrival. Vehicles were stabilized and absorbant applied to spilled fluids.

11:05 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a possible grass fire in the area of Hungry Hollow and Hall Road. On scene, fire staff found no sign of smoke. After further investigation, a small fire was found on the trail and extinguished.

12:55 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a single-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Fifth Line and 10 Sideroad. While enroute fire was advised they were not required.

20:21 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Danby Rd. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. It was suggested to resident that detectors should be cleaned.
