Weekly Incident Summary

June 5-11, 2017

HALTON HILLS, ON –

Tuesday, June 6, 2017

03:28 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Hyde Park Dr. Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff assisted with gaining entry into the building and cleared the scene.

10:56 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Brigden Gate. On scene fire met with building personnel who advised that the alarm was accidentally activated when a staff member turned on the valve at the inspector test pipe, causing water to flow through the sprinkler system causing the alarm.

17:23 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of 25 Sideroad & Guelph Line. On scene fire staff extricated the patient from the vehicle and assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with patient care until Ornge air ambulance arrived.

11:00 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Steeles Ave & Ninth Line. On scene, fire staff stabilized the vehicles and provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

18:03 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Highway 7 and 22 Sideroad. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff stabilized the vehicles and cleared the scene.

Thursday, June 8, 2017

Friday, June 9, 2017

03:58 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Queen St E in Acton. On scene fire staff checked the building and spoke with staff who were not aware of any alarms going off. No further action required.

22:49 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Diary Drive in Acton. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have a valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the homeowner was advised to renew their burn permit for any future burns.

19:45 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Third Line. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that the alarm had activated during testing. No further action required
