Weekly Incident Summary

October 23-29, 2017

HALTON HILLS, ON –

Monday, October 23, 2017

13:39 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Todd Road. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that they had an AC power failure of the panel and that the service tech was on scene already attempting to troubleshoot and repair the issue.

Tuesday, October 24, 2017

05:43 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on John St. On scene fire staff spoke with the tenant where the alarm was sounded, who advised that cooking had set off the alarm. No further concerns.

Thursday, October 26, 2017

08:16 Hours - Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Hepburn Cres. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. After inspection of the detector, it was determined that the alarm was chirping for low batteries. Fire staff replaced the batteries and cleared the scene.

Friday, October 27, 2017

16:59 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Five Sideroad. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who advised that unattended cooking, which resulted in light smoke, had activated the alarm system.

23:37 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an unknown odour on Academy Rd. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. The odour seemed more like sewage. Fire staff ran water down the floor drains in the basement, with no other problems found.

Saturday, October 28, 2017

08:22 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on River Dr. Upon arrival smoke was visible from the interior of a dilapidated structure. Fire staff discovered three persons sleeping next to a fire that was being used for warmth. The fire was extinguished with no further concerns.

09:01 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on John St. On scene fire staff discovered that the alarm had been activated due to burnt toast. No further concerns.

09:55 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a stove top fire, that had already been extinguished by the homeowner, on Russell St. On scene fire staff used a shovel to remove the remnants of the material ignited on the stove top. Following the remnants

being removed the home was inspected and ventilated. Fire staff spoke with the homeowner who advised that a plastic bag of candy on the stovetop had ignited

11:42 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Fourth Line in Acton. On scene fire staff found no concerns. Fire staff spoke with the homeowner who advised that the self-cleaning function of the oven had set off the alarm.

12:48 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the intersection of Mountainview & Danby Rd. On scene fire staff provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived. Power to both vehicles was disconnected prior to being cleared by Halton Regional Police.

16:29 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision on 15 Sideroad, west of Fourth Line in Acton. On scene fire staff assisted with patient care and disabled both vehicles. Fire staff also provided traffic control.

17:18 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of McNabb & Queen St. Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff disabled both vehicles and cleared debris off the road.

18:52 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a possible structure fire in the area of Glen Lawson & Third Line in Acton. On scene fire staff found a make-shift shelter, approximately 4m x 4m in size, fully involved. Fire staff pushed the structure in on itself to burn out and extinguish the perimeter to prevent it from spreading. The fire was quickly controlled and extinguished using water from the adjacent creek.

Sunday, October 29, 2017

15:22 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an unknown odour investigation on Moultreys Cres. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who complained of a gas smell outside their residence. An investigation around the home found a leak in the gas meter system. Union Gas was contacted to attend on scene to repair the meter connection.

23:02 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a dryer fire on Dayfoot Dr. On scene fire staff found white smoke coming from the front door. Fire staff entered the home and quickly knocked down the fire. No fire, heat, or smoke damage to the structure, with only minor charring on the surrounding walls beside the dryer. The dryer was destroyed and inoperable. Total fire damage is estimated at approximately \$500.00.
