Weekly Incident Summary October 30 – November 5, 2017

HALTON HILLS, ON –

Monday, October 30, 2017

09:13 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Third Line in Erin. On scene fire staff provided patient care until ambulance arrived.

Tuesday, October 31, 2017

12:17 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a single-vehicle motor vehicle collision on Armstrong Ave. Upon arrival on scene, fire staff was advised they were not required.

13:24 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Guelph St. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that a smoke machine, as part of a Halloween display, had activated one of the smoke detectors.

16:48 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a garbage bin fire on Queen St E in Acton. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who had just finished extinguishing the fire. Crews confirmed the fire was out and cleared the scene.

17:53 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a pedestrian struck by a vehicle in the area of Mill & Main St in Acton. While enroute fire was advised they were not required.

17:53 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a pedestrian struck by a vehicle in the area of Mill & Main St. Halton Regional Paramedics and Halton Regional Police were on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

Wednesday, November 1, 2017

08:17 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Guelph St. On scene fire staff met with building personnel who advised that a sprinkler line had broken and water was flowing in the sprinkler room. The water flow was stopped and the alarm silenced. Sprinkler technicians were on their way to repair the broken pipe.

Thursday, November 2, 2017

09:52 Hours - Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Greenore Cres in Acton. On scene fire staff assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with loading the patient into the ambulance and cleared the scene.

10:40 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an ambulance assist on Elizabeth Dr. On scene fire staff assisted Halton Regional Paramedics with loading the patient into the ambulance and cleared the scene.

18:54 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Acton Blvd in Acton. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did not have a valid burn permit. The fire was extinguished and the burn permit process was explained for any future burns.

22:02 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a vehicle fire in the area of Regional Road 25 and 10 Sideroad. On scene fire staff found the engine compartment of the vehicle fully involved and spreading to the passenger compartment. Fire staff quickly extinguished the fire with no further concerns.

Friday, November 3, 2017

16:13 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on 15 Sideroad. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did have a valid burn permit and was burning within the parameters of the burn permit. No further concerns.

17:49 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a burn complaint on Sixth Line. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who did have a valid burn permit but was not burning within the regulations of the permit. The fire was extinguished.

Young children are naturally curious about fire, but matches and lighters can be deadly in the hands of children. Too many children die in fires they start themselves, so adults must keep all fire starting materials out of the sight and reach of children. If you smoke, have only one lighter and keep it with you at all times.
