Weekly Incident Summary

November 6-12, 2017

HALTON HILLS, ON –

Monday, November 6, 2017

13:48 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a public assist on Regan Cres. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who was concerned that their oven was overheating. Fire staff investigated and found no concerns.

22:45 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a public assist on Doctor Moore Court. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings of carbon monoxide. Faulty batteries were replaced with no further concerns.

Tuesday, November 7, 2017

13:31 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Barber Dr. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who advised that their smoke alarms were going off throughout the home with no evidence of a problem. After some troubleshooting it was determined to be a faulty inter-connected smoke alarm. The smoke alarm was replaced with no further concerns.

17:13 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Main St & Cobblehill Rd in Acton. On scene fire staff disconnected the batteries and applied absorbant to leaking fluids.

Wednesday, November 8, 2017

02:43 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Harley Ave. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. After investigation it was determined that the CO detector had malfunctioned. No further concerns.

06:01 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Atwood Ave. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. Possible self-test was heard as newer smoke/CO detectors were installed in this home. All detectors were tested and found to be in proper functioning order. No further concerns.

18:47 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Treanor Cres. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. After investigation it was determined that the CO detector had malfunctioned. No further concerns.

19:10 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Tenth Line and 10 Sideroad. On scene fire staff stabilized the vehicles and provided traffic control until Halton Regional Police arrived.

Thursday, November 9, 2017

01:51 Hours - Fire fighters responded to the report of a single-vehicle motor vehicle collision on Mountainview Rd S. Halton Regional Paramedics and Halton Regional Police were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff stabilized the vehicle and applied absorbant to leaking fluids.

08:31 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Eaton Street. On scene fire staff met with building personnel. Upon entering the building fire staff noticed an overpowering smell of burnt electrical. An investigation found that a baseboard heater had malfunctioned. Fire staff confirmed that the power to the heater was disconnected and that a service company was called to do the repairs.

17:53 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Sargeant Rd & Delrex Blvd. Halton Regional Police and Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival. Fire staff ensured the vehicles were secured and cleared the scene.

21:09 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on McIntyre Cres. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. Fire staff replaced the battery in the CO with no further concerns.

Friday, November 10, 2017

07:22 Hours – Fire fighters responded to the report of a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Regional Road 25 and 22 Sideroad. On scene fire staff stabilized both vehicles and provided patient care until Halton Regional Paramedics arrived.

15:09 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Chaplin Cres. On scene an audible alarm was heard from outside the home, with no sign of the residents inside. Fire staff checked through the second floor windows using a roof ladder, and checked all the doors and visible main floor windows and could find no reason for the alarm. Unable to make contact with the homeowners, fire staff left the home with the audible alarm still activating.

20:48 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Rachlin Dr in Acton. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. No further concerns.

Saturday, November 11, 2017

07:41 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Moore Park Cres. On scene fire staff entered the home and using detectors found zero readings. Fire staff changed the battery in one smoke alarm at the bottom of the basement stairs. No further concerns.

11:35 Hours – Fire fighters responded to a medical assist in the area of Charles & James Streets. At the Remembrance Day ceremony fire staff assisted a Halton Regional Paramedic Supervisor with an attendee experiencing a medical emergency.

Sunday, November 12, 2017

14:16 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an alarm activation on Armstrong Avenue. On scene fire staff, with the help of building personnel, found a broken pipe on the roof for the sprinkler system for the dust collection system. Building personnel shut off the flow of water to that zone and reset the system. Service technicians were called to repair the break. No further concerns.

21:06 Hours – Fire fighters responded to an unknown odour on Lewis St. On scene fire staff met with the homeowner who complained of a natural gas smell. Using detectors fire staff checked the home and found zero readings. The furnace and hot water heater were activated with no readings. No further concerns.

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is a gas that can make you ill and even cause death. Remove vehicles from the garage right away after starting and never run a fuelled engine or other motor in a garage, even if garage doors are open. Carbon monoxide (CO) from these items can accumulate and become dangerous both in the garage and even in the home. Also, make sure your home has a working CO alarm to protect your family.
